

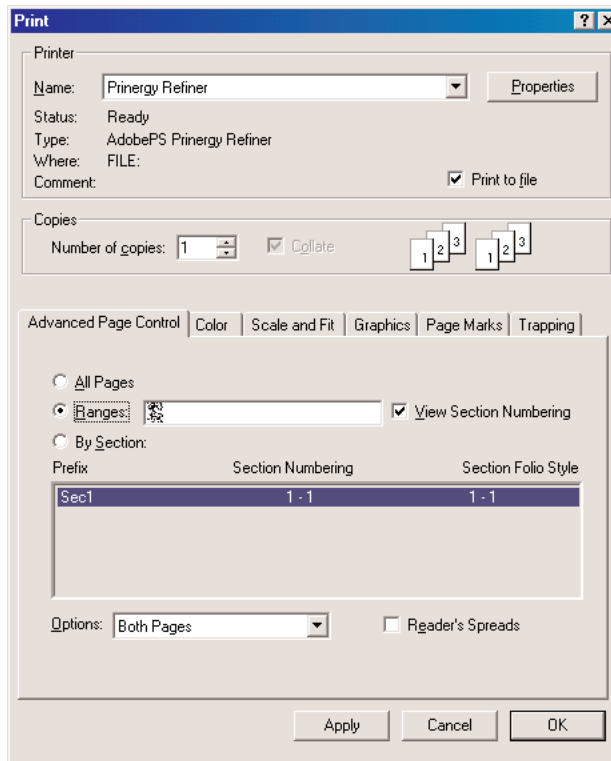
Adobe InDesign Postscripting

Before you start: Install the PPD for the Prinergy Refiner and the Adobe printer driver for your operating system into the appropriate directories. You may download copies of these files from the BPG-EPP web site, www.bpgcpp.com.

Preflight the job and fix any problems.

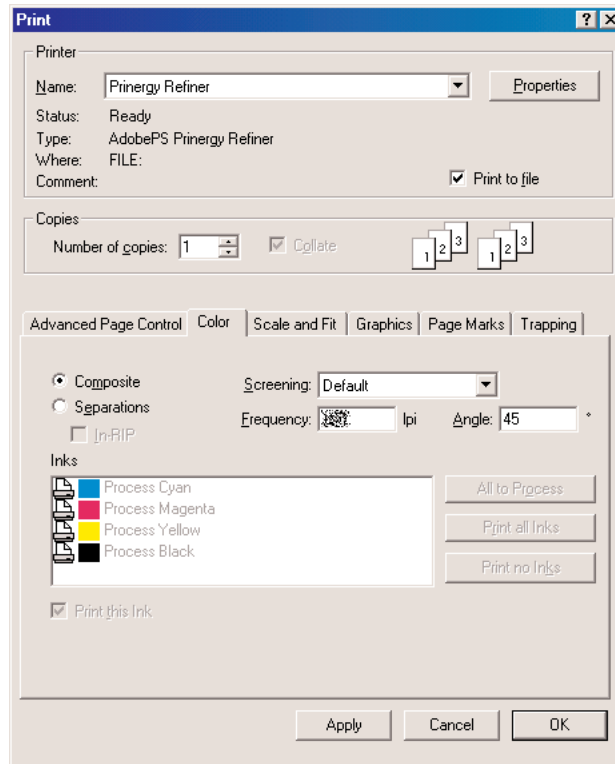
Place all page elements in the Adobe InDesign document. Pages must be complete.

1. Before postscripting, be sure to set up a PostScript printer to create files.
2. From the *File* menu, choose *Print*. Change the *Printer* choice to *Prinergy Refiner*. In the *Pages Range*, enter the page to write to PostScript. **Each page must have its own PS file.**

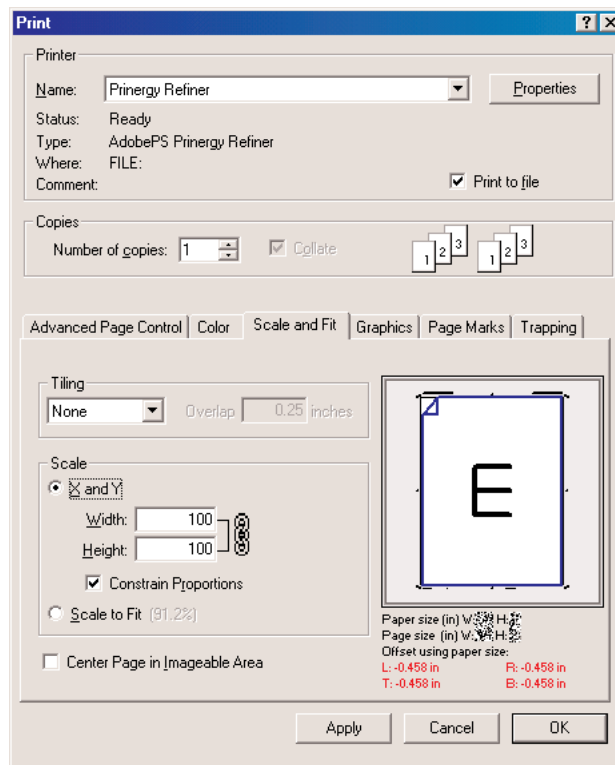

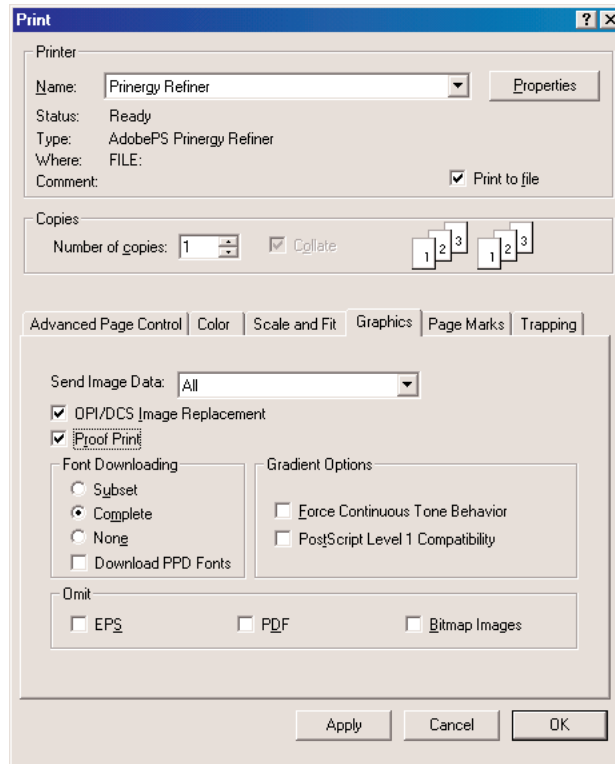
- From the *Advanced Page Control* tab, choose *Color*. Edit to match the following screen capture. *Frequency* equals the linescreen of your magazine.



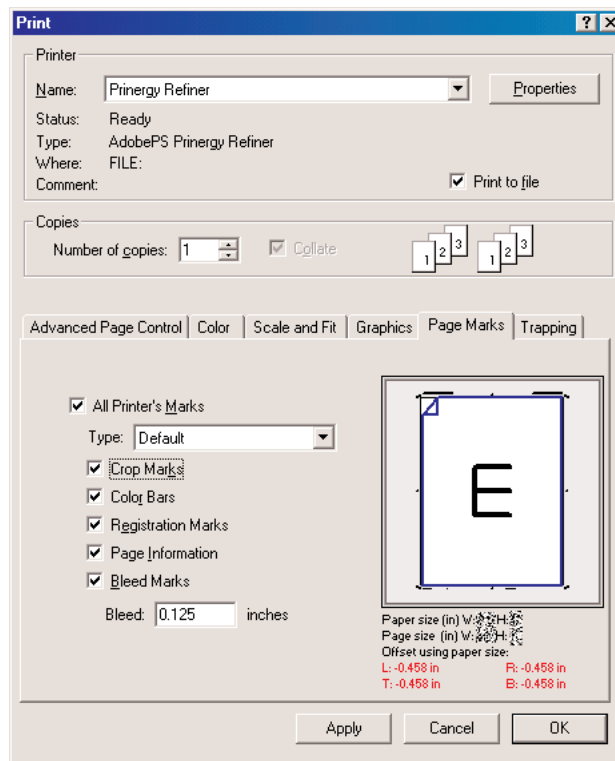
- From the *Color* tab, choose *Scale and Fit*. Edit to match the following screen capture.



9. From the *Scale and Fit* tab, choose *Graphics*. Edit to match the following screen capture.



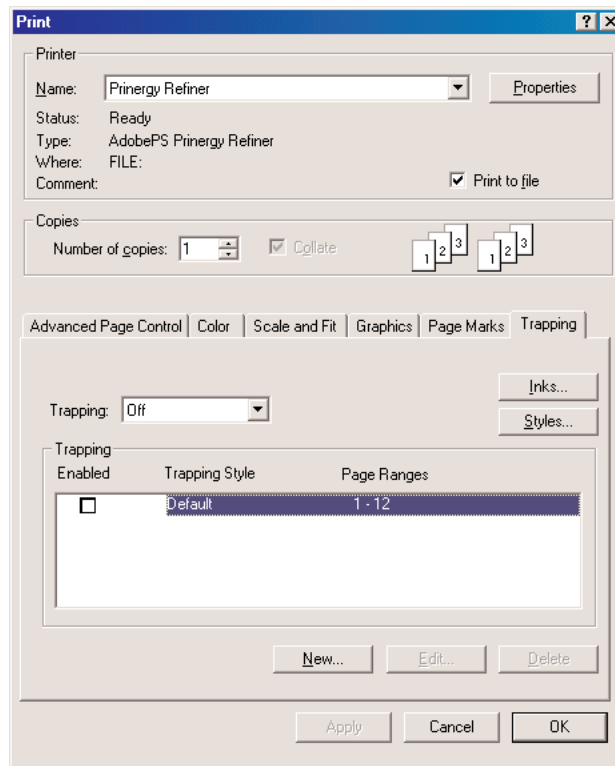
10. From the *Graphics* tab, choose *Page Marks*. Edit to match the following screen capture. *Bleed* should be set to 0.125. The values for *Paper size*, *Page size*, and *Offset using paper size* will depend on the trim size of your magazine.



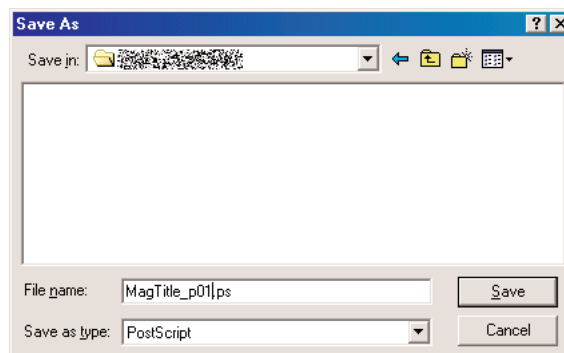

The Prinergy system used by Banta Publications will automatically trap your pages for you.

11. From the *Page Marks* tab, choose *Trapping*. Edit to match the following screen capture.



12. Click OK. Navigate to where you want your PostScript file to be saved. Name each PostScript as follows: **MagazineName_PageNumber.ps**. Pages 1-9 should be named with "spacer zeroes", i.e. p01, p02 (see example below). **Please do not use special characters such as dashes (-), slashes (/), etc. in your file name. Use alphanumeric characters and underscores (_) only.** Click *Save*.
